The Story of Johnny Seadlund

Come hear the story of Johnny Seadlund, a promising 1928 graduate of Crosby-Ironton who turned to a life of crime following a series of tragic circumstances. He made the FBI's "Most Wanted" list for car theft, bank robberies, kidnapping and murder. He was eventually arrested in California by a team of FBI agents led by J. Edgar Hoover himself and was executed in Chicago in 1938, 13 days shy of his 28th birthday. His body was returned to Minnesota by undertaker Severin E. Koop (Koop Funeral Home) and was buried next to his father in Woodland Cemetery near Ironton.



The story will be narrated by Terry McCullough, a local historian and former publisher of the Brainerd Daily Dispatch. McCullough has extensively researched the story of Johnny Seadlund from newspaper files and tells the tale in riveting details.

The presentation will be outdoors from the deck of the museum.
